Air Cargo Security Framework


Key participants:

- Known Consignors (KC)
- Regulated Air Cargo Agents (RACA)
- Accredited Air Cargo Agents (AACA)
- All outbound air cargo must be subject to security examination either through a RACA or originate from a KC




Why we are making changes

- Alleged plot to attack a flight departing Sydney Airport
- Device placed into passenger's baggage
- Increased security measures at Australian airports



A game changer



- Terrorists continue to innovate
- Sophisticated threats can be imported
- Air cargo is both a vector and a target

Enhanced Air Cargo Examination (EACE)



- Piece level examination for all outbound air cargo
- Examination of air cargo by RACAs under an EACE notice

EACE notice

- Sets out the methods and techniques available to examine and clear air cargo
- Equipment requirements
- Cargo examination exemptions



Existing Industry Participants

- Air Cargo Examination Notices which allow for cargo to be examined at a consolidated level will cease to exist
- Existing Known Consignors will be able to use their status for clearing all their international air cargo
- RACAs must move to examination under EACE notice



Known Consignor Scheme

SCREENING REQUIREMENTS FOR US-BOUND AIR CARGO FROM 1 JULY 2017



- Originators of cargo
- Security measures and procedures in place that will ensure safety of cargo as it moves through the supply chain
- Based on International Civil Aviation Organisation's six pillars of a secure supply chain



How do I become a Known Consignor



- Lodgement of online Expression of Interest
- Application form
- Onsite validation
- Ongoing compliance monitoring


Australian Trusted Trader and Known Consignor alignment



- Focus on enhanced information sharing and operational co-ordination
- Streamlined processes for:
 - Existing Trusted Traders applying for Known Consignor
 - Existing Known Consignors applying for Trusted Trader
 - New applicants to both Trusted Trader and Known Consignor
