"Chain of Responsibility – reasonable steps for customs brokers"  In the NHVR's guidance materials, consignors are treated as the party who requests "an operator of the heavy transport vehicle (directly, indirectly or through their representative) to transport the goods by road". Customs brokers regularly contract carriers to collect containers from the wharf and deliver to customers. Even if customs brokers are not engaged contractually with a carrier, they will alert the carrier that there will be a container to be collected and delivered and then pass a delivery order from a shipping line. This session will assist you in understand the reasonable steps that a customs broker should take under the new laws.
