<p>“Chain of Responsibility – reasonable steps for customs brokers”</p> <p>In the NHVR’s guidance materials, consignors are treated as the party who requests “<i>an operator of the heavy transport vehicle (directly, indirectly or through their representative) to transport the goods by road</i>”. Customs brokers regularly contract carriers to collect containers from the wharf and deliver to customers. Even if customs brokers are not engaged contractually with a carrier, they will alert the carrier that there will be a container to be collected and delivered and then pass a delivery order from a shipping line.
