WESTERN SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT FACT SHEET: INAUGURAL SINGAPORE AIRLINES TICKETS ON SALE

Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport (WSI):

- International tickets are now on sale to fly from Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport (WSI) with airline partner Singapore Airlines (SIA).
- WSI will be capable of catering for up to 10 million passengers a year upon opening and eventually grow to become Australia's primary gateway with capacity to handle 82 million annual passengers, akin to London's Heathrow Airport today.
- Passengers flying out of WSI will experience a streamlined departure with access to next generation technology to help them move through the airport at speed, while both domestic and international gates are under one roof, making travellers connections simple and efficient.
- WSI's integrated terminal includes common-use infrastructure for both domestic and international operations, which includes 40 check-in kiosks and 34 bag drops that will help reduce queuing as they can be used by any passenger flying with any airline.
- WSI's [major construction works were completed in June 2025](#) – which included WSI's terminal; its 3.7km runway, and the precinct's carparks, roads, bridges and utilities.
- Well over 10,000 workers helped complete WSI's major construction works – more than half of whom came from Western Sydney and a third of whom were learning on the job.
- The [Western Sydney Airport Transmission Substation](#), a new 132 kV digital transmission substation built to deliver the first major power supply into WSI, was recently unveiled. As Endeavour Energy's largest indoor transmission substation, it can scale as the airport expands over the coming decades.
- There will be many ways to travel to and from WSI, including by road on the new toll-free M12 motorway that gives direct access to WSI where travelers can then use more than 6,000 car parking spaces.
- Passengers can also choose to use ride-share, taxis, private transfers or the [new Western Sydney public buses](#) that will connect from Penrith, Oran Park, Campbelltown, Liverpool, Mount Druitt and Leppington to WSI, starting on July 5 2026.
- There will also be a [free public bus service running between WSI and the St Marys train and bus interchange](#), which will begin prior to the airport's opening. These free bus services will be phased out when the *Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport* services begin.

- SIA's inaugural flight, SQ201, is scheduled to depart Singapore Changi Airport at 11.30am (local time) on 23 November 2026 and arrive at 10.20pm (local time).
- The return flight, SQ202, is scheduled to depart Western Sydney International Airport on the same day at 11.55pm (local time) and arrive in Singapore at 05.05am (local time) on 24 November 2026.
- The daily services will operate on an Airbus A350-900 medium-haul aircraft, which features 303 seats in two cabin classes: 40 in Business Class and 263 in Economy Class.
- The new late-night departure from WSI provides more seamless connections to SIA's global network:
 - More than 130 destinations in 37 countries and territories, including to Europe, North Asia, Southeast Asia and America.
- SIA operates 140 weekly services from seven cities (Adelaide, Brisbane, Cairns, Darwin, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney)
 - SIA Group's low-cost subsidiary Scoot currently operates 40 weekly flights from Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.
 - With the addition of Western Sydney International, SIA will serve eight destinations in Australia.
- Between Sydney and Singapore, SIA currently offers 10,213 weekly seats in each direction, operated by:
 - Two daily Airbus A380 services
 - One daily Boeing 777-300ER service
 - One daily Airbus A350-900 long haul service
- When services to WSI commence in November 2026, SIA will add 2,121 weekly seats in each direction between Sydney and Singapore, bringing total capacity to 12,334 weekly seats each way.
