NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS

Morning Lynn (MLN) (CF840 / OF840)

Dear Valued Customer,

MV Morning Lynn, voyage CF840, arrived Auckland port 29 December. During an MPI inspection prior to commencement of discharge several dead bugs and a live BMSB were found. Under direction of the MPI, a portion of NZ bound cargo was able to be discharged, however some cargo was directed to remain on board until an appropriate level of treatment per the MPI guidelines is completed.

Mon 7th January – WW Ocean has been directed by the MPI to depart the MV Morning Lynn from Auckland. MV Morning Lynn will now proceed on the 7th Jan to Brisbane Australia with fumigators on board to fog the cargo and vessel en route and prior to arrival in Brisbane with the aim of identifying if any further bug activity is present. This has been decided due to berth and wharf congestion currently being experienced in Auckland.

All overcarried NZ cargo will be discharged in Brisbane with the plan to load the return cargo to Auckland on the next available vessel. A revised timeline and associated costs for the return of the cargo will be communicated separately with cargo owners.

A revised schedule subject to DAWR approval to berth in Brisbane is below;
